Directions is a specifically designed and fully integrated programme of support which will improve the employability of 1776 local residents who are currently not in work.

Directions will:

- Support individuals to develop their confidence and self esteem.
- Support people into training and Education.
- Enable people to participate on active Job Search.
- Connect participants to volunteering, specific job and job trial opportunities.
- Support 675 people to be in employment 6 months after leaving the project.
- Connect them to other support programmes e.g. Ways to Work ILM, Apprenticeship, AEB provision, Building Better Opportunities — Better Off Finance and Digital Projects and Household into Work.
- Provide a branded One Front Door for people to access information on the project, its benefits and to ensure that there is not customer confusion.

The programme which is part funded by European Social Fund will be:
